TUITION FEES

In the Czech Republic, academic programmes taught in foreign languages are required by law to charge tuition fees

COLLABORATION WITH STANFORD

The Stanford U.S.-Russia Forum (SURF) is a student exchange program that brings together around 25 Russian and American students to work on joint projects.

The program implies project work coached by relevant faculty and annual student-to-student conferences in 2024, 2025, and 2026




